Poppy Places and Spaces is an opportunity for you to explore the power of design as part of remembrance and reflection. It supports the question, **"Why is it important to remember?"**



What do we have to do?

We want you to design a **Poppy Place and Space** - an area for remembrance and reflection to commemorate 100 years since the end of the First World War in 2018.

This could be an outdoor or indoor space.

You should work together to submit an entry as a class.

What do we win?

There will be one overall winner picked from a public vote of a shortlist of three Primary School age category (P4-P7) and three in the Secondary School age category (S1-S3).

The overall winners will have the opportunity to build their **Poppy Place and Space**.*

Runners up will receive a prize.

How do we enter?
